Improve the Quality of the BRITJ

- share experiences of how tax policy can be designed; share experiences of countries who have built up their capacity; promote BRI tax cooperation; promote mutual learning (Pascal Saint-Amans);
- focus on the latest development of tax legislation and tax administration practices as well as interesting tax cases in the BRI countries/regions (Rup Khadka);
- increase highly respected source of information and analysis with respect to international tax issues, especially those issues of interest to BRITACOM member countries (Brian J. Arnold);
- highlight the link between international trade and tax in order to identify BRITJ' s unique cliché from other tax journals (Daniel Witt);



Improve the Quality of the BRITJ

- articles should be at cutting edge rather than mere descriptive. (Jeffrey Owens);
- topics covered could be are of different levels of details and relevance, therefore covering different audiences (Christian Kaeser);
- gather feedbacks from the recipients on how helpful a contribution was for their particular area of work (Christian Kaeser);
- continue to solicit contributions from tax practitioners (Liu Yi);
- consider the use of a standardized taxonomy (Daniel Witt); and
- for cover design, colors could be simplified (Pascal Saint-Amans).
